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1. INTRODUCTION

Dear Customer,

Thank you for purchasing your Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH. Correctly used and maintained, this tool will give a satisfactory performance for many years.

<u>Warning</u>



Your device contains numerous recoverable or recyclable materials. Return it to you dealer or, failing this, to an approved servicing centre to be treated.

Comply with the regulations in force in your country as concerns environmental protection associated with your activity.



Warning

It is imperative that you read through the ENTIRE user's manual before using or servicing the tool. Always comply with the instructions and illustrations in the manual.

All through this user guide you will find advisory notes and information entitled: NOTE, IMPORTANT, ATTENTION and WARNING.

The points marked "NOTE" indicate additional information.

The points marked "IMPORTANT" warn the user of a potential risk to the equipment.

The points marked "ATTENTION" warn the user of a potentially hazardous situation which if not avoided leads to minor injuries.

The points marked "WARNING" warn the user of a potentially hazardous situation which if not avoided leads to serious injury or death.

The warning indicates that damage resulting from failure to comply with the procedures and instructions is not covered by the warranty and the owner will be liable for any repair costs.

Safety indications are also given on the tool; they remind you of the safety precautions to be taken. Identify and read these indications before using the tool. Immediately replace any indications that may become partially illegible or deteriorated.

Refer to Section 2.6, "Safety signage" for the location diagram of the safety stickers affixed to the tool.

- The company PELLENC also declines all responsibility in the event of damage caused by the use of mulching blades with a diameter greater than 320 mm.

2.1. GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNINGS

Warning

Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. *Failure to comply with the following instructions risks causing electric shock, fire and/ or serious injury.*

Retain all the safety measures and instructions for later reference.

Disconnect the battery before carrying out maintenance.

<u>Note</u>

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

2.1.1. WORK AREA SAFETY

- 1. Keep the work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- 2. Do not operate power tools in an explosive atmosphere, for example in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks, which can ignite dust or fumes.
- 3. Keep children and bystanders away while operating the power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control of the tool.

2.1.2. ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- 1. The power tool connector must be adapted to the socket. Never modify the connector in any way whatsoever. Do not use adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and suitable sockets reduce the risk of electric shock.
- 2. Avoid contact with earthed surfaces such as pipes, radiators, cookers, and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is in direct contact with the ground.
- 3. Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- 4. Do not misuse the power cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges and moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.
- 5. **Use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use when operating power tools outdoors.** Use a cord suitable for outdoors to reduce the risk of electric shock.
- 6. Use a power supply protected by a residual current device (RCD) when the power tool is operated in a damp location. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.

Note

The term "Residual Current Device" (RCD) can be replaced by "Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter" (GFCI) or "Earth Leakage Circuit Breaker" (ELCB).

2.1.3. PERSONAL SAFETY

- 1. Stay alert, watch what you are doing, and use common sense when operating the power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention when using a power tool can result in serious personal injury.
- 2. **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** Safety equipment such as dust masks, non-slip safety shoes, helmets, or ear protection used at the appropriate times reduces injuries.
- 3. Avoid accidental starting of the tool. Make sure the switch is in the off position before you connect the tool to the power source and/or battery pack, pick it up, or carry it. Carrying a power tool with your finger on the switch or connecting a power tool with the switch in the 'on' position can cause accidents.
- 4. **Remove any adjusting wrench before switching the electric tool on.** A wrench left attached to a rotating part can cause injury.
- 5. **Do not rush. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** This provides better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.
- 6. Dress appropriately. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep hair and clothing away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can get caught in moving parts.
- 7. If devices are provided for connecting dust extraction and collection equipment, ensure that these are connected and properly used. Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.
- 8. Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles. A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.

2.1.4. POWER TOOL USE AND CARE

- 1. **Do not force the power tool. Use the power tool suited for the job.** The adapted power tool does the work better and more safely at the speed it was built to operate at.
- 2. Do not use the power tool if the switch does not allow it to be switched on and off. Power tools that cannot be controlled by a switch are dangerous and must be repaired.
- 3. Unplug the tool from the socket or remove the battery (if possible) before any adjustment, change of accessory or storage. These preventive safety measures reduce the risk of accidentally starting the power tool.
- 4. When not in use, keep power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate it. Power tools are dangerous when operated by inexperienced users.
- 5. Maintenance of the power tool and its accessories is mandatory. Check that the moving parts are not out of alignment or jammed, that there are no broken parts or that there is no other condition which could affect the operation of the power tool. If damaged, repair the power tool before using it. Many accidents are due to poorly maintained power tools.
- 6. Keep the cutting elements sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting elements are less likely to jam and are easier to control.
- 7. Use the power tool, accessories, blades, etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be done. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.
- 8. **Handles and gripping surfaces must be kept dry, clean and free from oils and grease**. Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.

2.1.5. BATTERY TOOL USE AND CARE

- 1. **Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer.** A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- 2. Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.

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- 3. When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- 4. Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, wash away with water. If liquid contacts eyes, seek additional medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.
- 5. **Do not use a battery pack or tool that is damaged or modified.** Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of injury.
- 6. **Do not expose a battery pack or battery operated tool to fire or excessive temperature.** Exposure to fire or temperatures exceeding 130° C (265° F) may cause an explosion.
- 7. Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the operating instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outside the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.

2.1.6. SERVICE

- 1. **Have the power tool serviced by a qualified technician using only identical spare parts.** This ensures the continued safety of the power tool.
- 2. **Never perform maintenance on damaged battery packs.** Maintenance on battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorised service providers.

2.1.7. TOOL'S END-OF-LIFE MANAGEMENT

1. When the tool reaches the end of its life, PELLENC keeps the end of life sheet of the equipment at disposal. The end of life sheet provides instructions for safely removing components.

2.2. SAFETY WARNINGS FOR THE GRASS CUTTER/STRIMMER, BRUSH CUTTER AND SAW BLADE BRUSH CUTTER

- 1. **Do not use the machine in adverse weather conditions, especially in the event of a risk of lightning.** This decreases the risk of being struck by lightning.
- 2. Carefully check that there is no wildlife present in the area where the machine is to be used. Wildlife can be injured by the machine in operation.
- 3. Carefully examine the area where the machine is to be used and remove all stones, sticks, wires, bones, and other foreign objects. Projected objects may cause injuries.
- 4. Before using the machine, always visually inspect the cutting device or blade and the cutting device or cutting assembly for damage. Damaged parts increase the risk of injury.
- 5. Before use, check the power cord and all extension cables for signs of damage or wear. Do not use the machine if the cable is damaged or worn. If the power cord is damaged or worn during use, turn off the power to the machine and do not touch the cord before disconnecting it from the power supply. A damaged power cord or extension cable can cause electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.
- 6. **Follow the instructions for changing accessories.** Improperly tightened blade securing nuts or bolts can damage the blade or come loose.
- 7. The rated rotational speed of the blade must be at least equal to the maximum rotational speed marked on the machine. Blades that spin faster than their rated rotational speed can break and shatter.
- 8. Wear eye, ear, head and hand protection. Proper protective equipment reduces injury from shards of debris or accidental contact with the strimmer wire or blades.
- 9. When operating the machine, always wear non-slip safety shoes. Do not operate the machine barefoot or with sandals on. This reduces the risk of foot injury from contact with the moving blade.
- 10. When operating the machine, always wear long pants. Exposed skin increases the likelihood of injury from flying objects.
- 11. Keep bystanders away when the machine is running. Flying debris can cause serious injury.
- 12. Always use both hands to operate the machine. Hold the machine with both hands to prevent loss of control.
- 13. Hold the machine by the insulated gripping surfaces only, as the cutting line or blade may come in contact with hidden electrical wires or its own cable. Strimmer wire or blades contacting an "active" cable can "activate" exposed metal parts of the machine and expose the operator to electric shock.
- 14. Always maintain good footing and operate the machine only while standing firmly on the ground. Slippery or unstable surfaces can cause loss of balance or loss of machine control.

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- 15. **Do not operate the machine on steep slopes.** This reduces the risk of loss of control, slipping or falling which can cause injury.
- 16. When working on a slope, always be sure of your footing, always work across a slope, never up or down, and be extremely careful when changing direction. This reduces the risk of loss of control, slipping or falling which can cause injury.
- 17. Keep all power cords away from the cutting blades. A damaged power cord can cause electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.
- 18. Keep all parts of your body away from the strimmer wire or blade when the machine is in operation. Before starting the machine, check that the strimmer wire or the blade are not in contact with any element. A moment of inattention while operating the machine may cause injury.
- 19. **Do not operate the machine above your waist height.** This is to prevent accidental contact with the cutting device or blade and to better control the machine in unforeseen situations.
- 20. When cutting underbrush or springy saplings, be careful of bounce back. If the strain in the wood fibers is released, brush or saplings can strike the operator and/or cause him to lose control of the machine.
- 21. Cut brush and saplings with extreme care. Fine debris can get caught in the machine, be projected and cause a loss of balance.
- 22. Keep control of the machine and do not touch the blades and other dangerous moving parts that are still in motion. This reduces the risk of injury from moving parts.
- 23. When clearing jams or repairing the machine, make sure all switches are off and the power cord is disconnected. Unintentionally activation of the machine while clearing jams or performing repairs could result in serious injury.
- 24. Carry the machine off and always away from the body. Correct handling of the machine reduces the likelihood of accidental contact with the moving blade.
- 25. When storing or transporting the machine, always cover the metal blades. Correct handling of the machine reduces the likelihood of accidental contact with the blade.
- 26. Use only replacement strimmer wire, cutting heads and blades specified by the manufacturer. Improper replacement of parts can increase the risk of breakage and injury.
- 27. When clearing jams or repairing the machine, make sure the switch is off and the battery pack has been removed. Unintentionally activation of the machine while clearing jams or performing repairs could result in serious injury.

2.3. PRECAUTIONS AGAINST KICKBACK

Kickback is a sudden sideways, forward or backward movement of the machine that can occur when the blade jams or hits an object (such as a sapling or stump). It can be violent enough to propel the machine and/or the operator, and possibly lose control of the machine.

Kickback and its associated hazards can be avoided by taking the necessary precautions listed below.

- 1. Maintain a firm grip with both hands on the machine and position your arms to resist the kickback. Position your body to the left of the machine. Kickback can increase the risk of injury from an unintended movement of the machine. Blade kickback can be controlled by the operator provided precautions have been taken.
- 2. If the blade gets stuck or if a cut is interrupted for any reason, turn the machine off and leave it stationary in the material until the blade comes to a complete stop. If the blade is stuck, never attempt to remove the machine from the material or pull it back while the blade is in motion, otherwise kickback may occur. Find the cause and take corrective actions to eliminate the cause of the blade sticking.
- 3. **Do not use dull or damaged blades.** Dull or damaged blades increase the risk of blockage or hitting an object, resulting in kickback.
- 4. Always maintain a clear view of the material being cut. Kickback is more likely to occur in areas where it is difficult to see the material being cut.
- 5. **If a person approaches while the machine is running, turn off the machine.** The risk of injury to others struck by the moving blade in the event of kickback is greater.

2.4. SAFETY WARNINGS RELATING TO THE BRUSH CUTTER EXCELION 2 LH

1. Do not use the metal cutting tools near walls, fences, tree trunks, rocks or similar obstacles. Contact with such elements can cause kickback, increased ricochets and damage the cutting tool. PELLENC recommends the

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use of CITY CUT for these working conditions. Clear the work zone of all obstacles (glass, stone, metal, waste, and other solid objects) as they can be projected when working with the cutting tool.

Never use the Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH with only one hand.

- Always use the machine with the cutting head parallel to the ground. The safety guard no longer provides sufficient protection if the angle of the cutting head is excessive, This can increase the risk of injury from flying debris.
- Immediately stop the Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH in the event of a change in the behaviour of the cutting tool (change in noise, increased vibrations). Check that the cutting tool is properly attached and verify its condition (no distortion, sufficiently sharp). Replace any damaged cutting tool as it can explode and cause serious, even fatal injuries.
- 4. CAUTION! The cutting tool continues rotating for a few seconds after the control trigger has been released. Always keep your hands and feet clear of the rotating cutting tool.
- 5. Strimmer wire
 - Never remove the blade installed in the safety guard as it trims the strimmer wire to the appropriate length.
 - Never use metal wire or any other material instead of the nylon strimmer wire. Metal wire is likely to break and be projected, causing serious injuries.
 - Only use nylon strimmer wire recommended by PELLENC with a max. diameter of 3 mm.


6. Cutting blades

- For the mulching blade, the maximum recommended dimensions are 280 mm in diameter and 3 mm in thickness.
- For the tri-blade and the twin-blade, the maximum recommended dimensions are 320 mm in diameter and 2.5 mm thickness.
- 7. Put on the harness and carrying strap of the tool.

2.5. SAFETY MEASURES RELATED TO THE USE OF THE PELLENC BATTERY AND CHARGER

Refer to the instructions supplied with the PELLENC battery and charger.





3. DESCRIPTION AND TECHNICAL CHARACTERISTICS

3.1. DESCRIPTION OF THE TOOL

- 1. Air exhaust screen: A hot air discharge screen that cools the motor and the electronic board.
- 2. Round handle tightening knob
- 3. Round handle
- 4. Distancing bar
- 5. Safety sticker: the arrow is an indication for the installation of the round handle.
- 6. Control trigger (power switch): used to activate the rotation of the cutting tool at a progressively adjustable speed.
- 7. Carrying ring
- 8. HMI screen
- 9. POWER / MENU button
- 10. Safety throttle: prevents the inadvertent activation of the control trigger; the safety throttle must be activated prior to activating the control trigger.
- 11. Angle gear
- 13. Safety guard for TAP CUT 3 / blades: limits the projections of solid objects (stones, pieces of metal) towards the operator.
- 14. Drive shaft
- 16. Air intake screen: cold air intake screen located under the tool and which cools the motor and the electronic board.
- 17. Hole for attaching the machine on a wall fixture
- 18. Anti-vegetation protection washer
- 19. Quick connector: used to connect the machine to the PELLENC tools battery
- 20. Carrying strap LH
- 22. TORX 25 wrench
- 23. EXCELION 2 special key
- 27. Blades adaptation accessories (1 blade locking washer, 1 protective bowl and 1 bowl retaining nut)

Note

The Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH is delivered without a cutting head.

The cutting heads are available for purchase separately. This operating instructions manual may refer to these cutting heads sold as options. For more information on their use, refer to Section 5.6.1, "Choice of the right cutting head according to the use".



Caution

3.2.3. VIBRATION AND NOISE EMISSION VALUES

The determination of noise levels and vibration rates is based on operating conditions at maximum rated speed according to a standardised test method. It can be used to compare two machines.

The total declared values for vibration and noise emissions can be used for a preliminary exposure assessment.

Caution

Vibrations during actual working use of the machine may differ from the total declared value, depending on the way the machine is used

It is necessary to identify safety measures to protect the operator, based on an estimate of exposure under actual operating conditions (taking into account all parts of the operating cycle, such as the time the machine is switched off and the time it is idling, in addition to the working time).

4. COMMISSIONING

4.1. PACKAGE CONTENTS

4.2. FITTING/DISMOUNTING THE ROUND HANDLE ON THE BRUSH CUTTER

4.2.1. FITTING THE ROUND HANDLE AND THE DISTANCING BAR ON THE TOOL


1. Carefully remove the tool from its packing box.

Lay the tool on a flat, stable and clean surface.

2. Fit the round handle (3) on the transmission tube (14) at a comfortable distance for the user's arm. The user's arm should be semi-flexed.


Ensure the correct orientation of the round handle. The arrow on the sticker on the round handle should point to the arrow on the sticker on the transmission shaft.

3. Lock the position of the round handle (3) by screwing the adjustment knob supplied with your tool (2).



Warning

To guarantee the safety of the user, it is necessary to respect a distance (A) between the top of the HMI screen and the top of the distancing bar, varies depending on the cutting tool.





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- 4. Position the distancing bar (4) on the transmission shaft (14).
- 5. Lock the position of the distancing bar (4) by tightening the screw.




Note

The distancing bar can be fixed either between the HMI screen and the round handle or after the round handle on the transmission shaft (9) but the distances recommended above must be observed.

<u>Note</u>


The carrying ring (7) must always be positioned between the two gripping handles of the tool (HMI screen and round handle (3)).

To consult the carrying ring adjustment procedure, refer to Section 4.8.2, "Movement of the carrier ring according to the centre of gravity".




4.2.2. DISMOUNTING THE ROUND HANDLE AND THE DISTANCING BAR FROM THE TOOL

- 1. Lay the tool on a flat, stable and clean surface.
- 2. Unscrew the screw located on the distancing bar (4).
- 3. Remove the distancing bar (4).





- 4. Unscrew the knob (2) located on the round handle (3).
- 5. Remove the round handle (3).



4.3. FITTING/ DISMOUNTING OF THE SAFETY GUARDS ON THE BRUSH CUTTER



Caution

Before any intervention on the tool, stop the machine completely and disconnect the battery. To consult the procedure for switching off your tool, refer to Section 5.1.2, "Stopping the tool".


Wear safety gloves. Handling of sharp elements.

4.3.1. ASSEMBLY/DISASSEMBLY OF THE SAFETY GUARD

The safety guard supplied as standard with your tool is mandatory when the tool is equipped with the TAP CUT 3 and weed control blades.


Fitting the standard safety guard

1. Fit the eyelet located on the upper part of the safety guard (13) on the top screw of the angle gears (11).




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- 2. Fit the lower part of the safety guard (13) by aligning the screw marks.

5.6. TIPS FOR USE AND WORKING TECHNIQUES

5.6.1. CHOICE OF THE RIGHT CUTTING HEAD ACCORDING TO THE USE


Whether you want to clean or beautify your green space, remove tall grass, wild shoots, thickets or bushes cluttering up a path, for each use of your Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH, there are a suitable PELLENC cutting head. It is therefore important to choose the right cutting head according to the intended job.

- 5.6.1.1. TAP CUT 2 AND 3 CUTTING HEADS

- They are ideal for mowing and edge trimming.
- They are mainly used in cases where the wear of the strimmer wire is significant (edge of wall, along fences, etc.).

Choice of strimmer wire

- For grass: use PELLENC ELECTRIC Ø 2.4 mm strimmer wire (reference 159893).
- For dense grass and brush: use PELLENC ELECTRIC strimmer wire Ø 2.7 mm (reference 159892).




- 5.6.1.2. WEED CONTROL BLADES AND MULCHING BLADES

These accessories have been specially designed for mowing/strimming brush, tall grass, woody vegetation and even shrubs.

Your tool is compatible with several special "large brush clearing" accessories.


Choice of accessory

- A. For dense grass and brush: use a Ø 320 mm twinblade (reference 158490) or a Ø 320 mm tri-blade (reference 158489).
- B. To cut and slash woody vegetation, dense brush or thorny vegetation: use a mulching blade (reference 158491) + a mulching kit (reference 57277).
- C. For cutting shrubs, shoots or coppices: use the sawing kit (reference 57275 with the chisel-tooth saw blade (reference 111700)).



- 5.6.1.3. CITY CUT HEAD

This cutting head can be used in green spaces as well as in the vicinity of homes. It was designed to limit projections and can therefore be used safely in urban areas.



For more information on the accessories available with your Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH, refer to Section 9.2, "Cutting tools".

5.6.2. ADVICE FOR OPTIMIZING THE BATTERY

In order to optimize the autonomy of your PELLENC battery as much as possible, the rotational speed of the cutting tool used must be adapted to the type of mowing.strimming work to be carried out.

This is because the higher the rotational speed of the cutting tool, the greater the energy consumption. Therefore the progressive nature of the control trigger must be used to adjust the rotational speed of the cutting tool.

5.6.3. TIPS FOR USE AND WORKING TECHNIQUES

- 1. Before starting mowing/strimming, examine the surface to be cleared: nature of the surface, area, relief, presence of obstacles, etc.
- 2. Note the wind direction. The latter may facilitate the removal of clippings and make the task of the user easier.


Important

Always keep a minimum distance of 50 mm between the cutting head and the obstacle in order to avoid any risk of damage to the tool and the "strands" (of strimmer wire).



Simple mowing/strimming

- Move the tool in semi-circles from left to right while gradually advancing.
- While weeding and clearing, keep the cutting tool parallel to the ground and avoid contact of the cutting head with the ground.



• To mow tall, dense grass, mow the upper part first, then the lower part.

Tall grass mowing


- The mowing movement is from right to left while left to right is the return movement.
- Mowing in one direction only helps with the disposal of cut grass.

Mowing on slopes

Important

Before starting to mow on a slope, make sure you are stable on the ground.

- 1. Position yourself at the base of the slope.
- 2. Define a strip parallel to the slope that spans the width of the work area.



Movement to be performed

• The operator must always work with the same movement with the arms: start at the highest side of the slope and finish his movement towards the bottom of the slope. This will allow the freshly cut grass to fall down slope. This will prevent the cutting attachment from turning in the grass that has already been cut.

Direction of progression

- The operator must always walk forward, following the strip defined at the start of the work.
- When said strip is finished, the user must retrace his steps and start a new strip slightly higher than the one which has just been completed.

Mowing along walls, fences, around trees and flower beds

- Use the TAP CUT 3 and its strimmer wire as this facilitates the removal of grass and avoids the phenomenon of kickbacks when in contact with a fixed obstacle.
- Protect bark and the edge of flower beds by using the safety guard as a shield between the surface area to be cleared and the vegetation to be protected.

Working with the clearing saw







Work without projections in an urban environment

- The CITY CUT cutting head is specially designed for weed control urban environments, in gravel, stabilized gravel or asphalt.
- Its counter-rotating technology avoids projections, the upper and lower blades rotating in the opposite direction to each other.
- According to the user's needs and to optimize his working comfort, the CITY CUT cutting head is oriented at 28° or 51° depending on the working direction.
- The quick fit assembly of the CITY CUT cutting head on the Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH takes 20 seconds.








5.7. EMERGENCY RELEASE

The Brush cutter Excelion 2 LH has a quick release system for the tool, making it possible to move away from it quickly in an emergency.

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In case of emergency:

1. Disconnect the quick connector from the tool (19) located on the harness.



- 2. Undo the "backpack" type buckle (22). The tool will fall to the ground.
- 3. Leave the tool in place and move away as quickly as possible to get out of danger.

10. WARRANTIES

10.1. GENERAL WARRANTIES

10.1.1. STATUTORY WARRANTY

- 10.1.1.1. LATENT DEFECTS WARRANTY

Apart from the commercial warranty provided for under Article II, Article 1641 of the Civil Code provides that "the seller is bound to a warranty on account of latent defects of the object sold which render it unfit for the use for which it was intended, or which would impair said use to the extent that the buyer would not have acquired it, or would only have given a lesser price for it, had he known of them".

Article 1648 of the Civil Code "The action resulting from latent defects must be brought by the purchaser within two years after the discovery of the defect. "

- 10.1.1.2. LEGAL WARRANTY OF CONFORMITY

Article L.217-4 of the French Consumer Code "The seller delivers goods in conformity with the contract and is liable for defects of conformity existing upon delivery".

The seller is also liable for any lack of compliance resulting from the packaging, assembly or installation instructions whenever its contractual liability is engaged in this regard or the latter are carried out under its responsibility

Article L.217-5 of the French Consumer Code "Goods are compliant with the contract":

- 1. Where they are fit for the purpose normally expected of similar goods and, where applicable:
 - If it matches the description given by the seller and possesses the qualities that were presented to the purchaser in the form of a sample or model;
 - If it possesses the qualities that a purchaser can reasonably expect given the public statements made by the seller, the producer or its representative, especially in advertising or labelling;

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2. Or, if it has the characteristics defined by mutual agreement of the parties or is fit for any particular purpose that the buyer made known to the seller and that the latter accepted.

Article L.217-12 of the Consumer Code "legal action resulting from lack of conformity lapses two years after delivery of the goods".

10.1.2. COMMERCIAL WARRANTYPELLENC

- 10.1.2.1. CONTENT

10.1.2.1.1. GENERAL INFORMATION

In addition to legal warranties, client users benefit from the commercial warranty on products PELLENCcovering the exchange and replacement of parts recognised as being out of order, due to machining defects, assembly defects or material defects, whatever the cause.

The warranty is fully integral to the product sold by PELLENC.

10.1.2.1.2. SPARE PARTS

The commercial warranty also covers original PELLENCspare parts, excluding labour and to the exclusion of certain parts of each product provided at delivery.

- 10.1.2.2. DURATION OF THE WARRANTY

10.1.2.2.1. GENERAL INFORMATION

PELLENC Products are guaranteed under the commercial warranty as from delivery to the customer for a period of two (2) years for products connected to a PELLENC battery, and for a period of one (1) year for other PELLENC products.

10.1.2.2.2. SPARE PARTS

PELLENC Replacement parts replaced under the product warranty are guaranteed under the commercial warranty as from delivery of the PELLENCproduct to the customer user for a period of two (2) years for products connected to a PELLENCbattery, and for a period of one (1) year for other PELLENCproducts.

In the case of products connected to a PELLENC battery, parts that are replaced under the product warranty after the 12th month of use, are covered for a period of one (1) year.

10.1.2.2.3. WARRANTY EXCLUSIONS

Excluded from the commercial warranty are products that have been subject to abnormal use, or were used under conditions and for purposes other than those for which they were manufactured, especially in the case of non-compliance with conditions stipulated in this user manual.

It does not apply in case of shock, fall, neglect, lack of supervision or maintenance or in case of transformation of the product. Also excluded from the warranty are products that have been subject to tampering, alteration or modification by the client user.

Wear parts and/or consumables cannot be covered by the warranty.

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- 10.1.2.3. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMMERCIAL WARRANTY

10.1.2.3.1. PRODUCT COMMISSIONING AND COMMISSIONING DECLARATION

The DISTRIBUTOR undertakes to complete the computer commissioning declaration form, no later than eight days after the delivery of the property to the user customer, in order to activate the latter on the www.pellenc.com website under "warranties and training" in the "extranet" menu, using the identifier previously provided to them by PELLENC.

Failing that, commissioning declaration will not be effective and implementation of the commercial warranty PEL-LENC will not occur. As a consequence thereof, the DISTRIBUTOR must ensure the financial burden of its intervention under the warranty without being able to pass on the cost to the client user.

The DISTRIBUTOR shall also undertake to complete the warranty card or the certificate of warranty and commissioning for self-propelled equipment provided with the product after having the client user sign and date it.

10.1.3. PAID AFTER-SALES SERVICE

- 10.1.3.1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Malfunctions, breakdowns, breakages resulting from misuse, neglect or improper maintenance by the client user as well as malfunctions resulting from normal wear of the product are subject to the payment of after-sales service, even during the period of the legal and commercial warranty. After-sales service repairs that fall outside of the legal and commercial warranty also include maintenance, adjustments, diagnostics of all types, and cleaning without the present list being exhaustive.

- 10.1.3.2. WEAR PARTS AND CONSUMABLES

Wear parts and consumables also fall within the after-sales service.

- 10.1.3.3. SPARE PARTS

Paid after-sales service also covers original PELLENC spare parts, excluding labour and outside the legal and commercial warranty period.

In case of replacement of original PELLENC spare parts in the context of after-sales service, said latter are covered by a warranty of one year as from the installation date.
